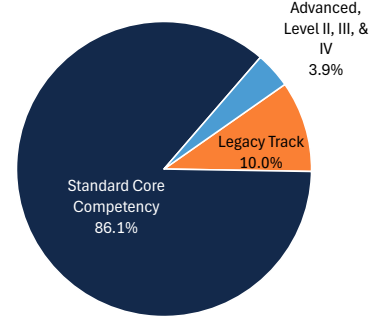

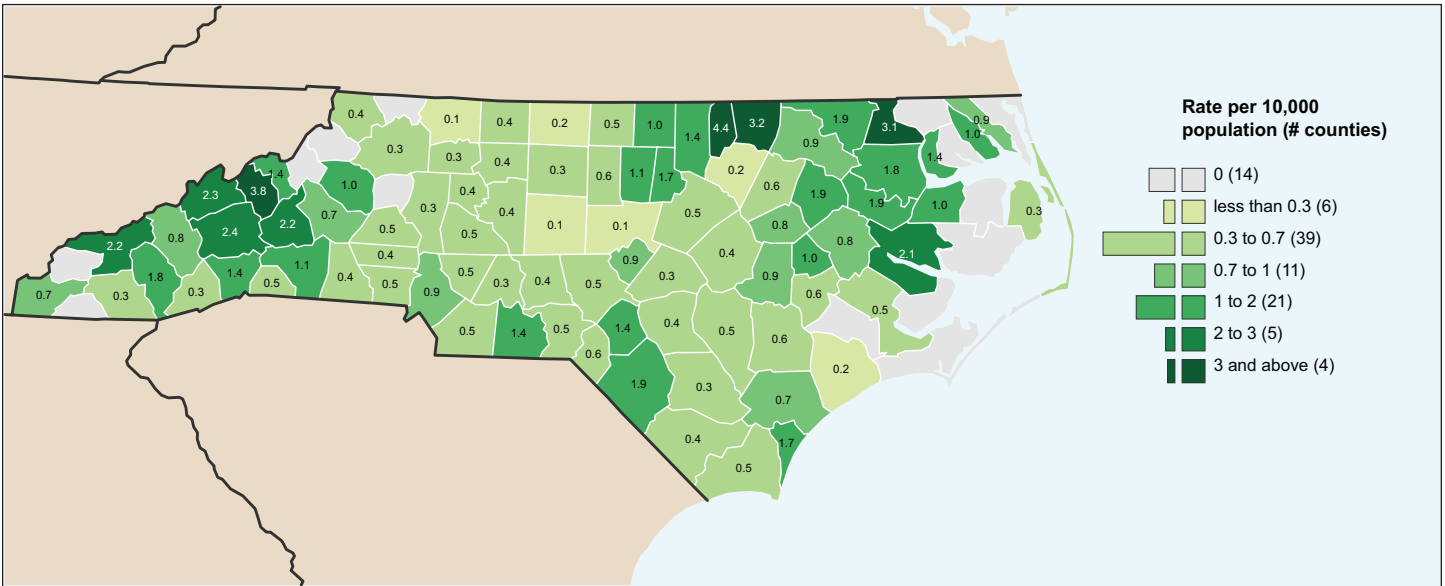
811 CHWs

0.7 per 10k, Metro
0.9 per 10k, Nonmetro

- The rate for CHWs active and in-state in 2024 was **0.74 per 10,000 population**.
- The rate per 10k is slightly higher in nonmetro counties (0.9 vs 0.7).
- CHW **supply is increasing**, from 811 in 2024 to 1,076 in fall 2025.
- Fifty-nine counties had a rate below the state average.
